## **Assistance Animal Registration Form**

Odessa College provides reasonable accommodations for assistance animals (also called emotional support, therapy or comfort animal) in our residence halls. An assistance animal is an animal that is necessary to afford a person with a disability an equal opportunity to use and enjoy a dwelling when there is an identifiable relationship between the Handler and the Assistance Animal.

Individuals who wish to have an Assistance animal in their on-campus residence hall room should complete this form a minimum of 10 business days prior to the start of the date in which the Assistance animal is due to arrive on campus and provide required documentation where indicated. This form should also be completed when there are any changes to information regarding a previously approved Assistance animal. Failure to complete this form in the required time frame will result in the handler providing alternative temporary housing for the animal until proper paperwork is completed at their own expense. Any student found harboring (giving food, shelter or water) an unapproved animal will be fined \$500 per violation even if the approval is granted at a later date. **Important:** The student listed above is seeking a disability-related service and special housing accommodation at Odessa College. In order to establish eligibility to have an assistance animal in the residence halls the student must provide current and comprehensive documentation of a disability that establishes the need for the request to be approved.

- An Assistance animal is an animal that is necessary to afford a person an accommodation for their mental, psychiatric, or emotional disorder.
- > Only animals classified as Assistance animals and/or service animals, as defined by the Americans with Disabilities Act as Amended, the Fair Housing Act and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, are allowed to live on-campus.
- > Requests for animals on campus and exemptions from non-pet rules will be decided on a case-by-case basis.
- Animals are required to be immunized against diseases common to that type of animal. The college has the authority to direct that animals receive veterinary attention.
- The animal must be on a leash, unless the leash would inhibit the animal's ability to be of service.
- No animal will be permitted in the residence halls that:
  - o is not approved by the Office of Student Life or Office of Residence Life
  - o poses a direct threat to the health and safety of others
  - would cause substantial physical damage to property of the college & other residents
  - o would pose an undue financial and administrative burden to the college
  - o would fundamentally alter the nature of the College's housing operations.
- Acceptable documentation must be received and approved by the Office of Residence Life prior to the Assistance animal being accepted for Residence Life.
- Odessa College reserves the right to request additional clarification or documentation to facilitate the requested accommodation.
- > Student must have an established relationship with the animal.
