#### **Course Description**

This course presents application of financial accounting concepts and principles for partnerships and corporations. Managerial and cost accounting are introduced: cost behavior, budgeting, responsibility accounting, cost systems and product costing, CVP, standard costs, variance analysis and incremental analysis. Learning activities are designed to allow students to apply acquired knowledge to exercises and problem-solving situations. Manual and computer applications allow students to integrate learned techniques and practices into problem-solving situations.

#### **Course Objectives**

The purpose of the course is to continue the preparation of business students for more advanced business and accounting courses. Emphasis is on familiarization with corporate accounting and utilization of accounting information for decision making.

- A. The course will illustrate accounting for corporate equity transactions: stock issues, treasury stock, dividends, ect.
- B. It will also illustrate corporate bond accounting: bond issues, interest, premium and discount, ect.

- C. It will demonstrate accounting procedures for a manufacturing enterprise: cost systems, product costing, standard costs, variances.
- D. The course will integrate basic management concepts with accounting information to demonstrate how managers make various decisions.
- E. The course will provide knowledge regarding budget preparation and its importance in planning and control.
- F. The course will provide knowledge regarding responsibility accounting systems and performance evaluations,
- G. The course will illustrate the accounting for various partnership transactions.
