Course description: Concepts of sets, functions, numeration systems, number theory, and properties of natural numbers, integers, rational and real number systems with an emphasis on problem solving and critical thinking. Outside paper: once during the semester, you must visit a math class, grade 3 to 6, and observe the teacher conducting the class. You should stay for the entire class. You will then write a one page (minimum) summary of what you observed in the class. You will need to contact a principal and teacher in an elementary school or middle school to arrange this. You may do this anytime during the semester. Your paper will be due by April 27. Your paper will be worth 16% of your grade.

Determination of your grade: at the end of the semester, you will have four exam grades. I will drop the lowest exam grade, then add your homework average, your grade on your paper, and your final exam grade. Each exam is worth 16% of your grade, and the final is 16% of your grade.
