Course Objective: This survey course in Federal government is designed to provide the student with a working knowledge of the United States national government. This knowledge will enable the student to become a better informed and participating citizen or our nation. The course is designed to provide the student with the opportunity to earn college credit for a course in federal government when circumstances prevent the student from attending a more traditional Odessa College course.

Course Requirements:

- 1. Textbook research/Independent research project
- 2. Four (4) Exams

Deadlines for the submission of the three areas listed above will be established by the instructor. All exams will be taken on the Odessa College campus at a time and place arranged by the professor. If a student, without making prior arrangements with the professor, fails to take the unit examinations by the established date, or fails to submit a research project; the course grade of (**F**) is automatically given.

Grading: The student will have four (4) exams. The professor will double the highest exam grade of each individual student. The project grade is equal to one exam. These points will be added together and divided by six (6), this will provide the student's course average. From the course average I will determine the final course grade.

- 2. Exam over Chapters assigned

Unit Three

- 1. Read Chapters 8, 10, 11, 13
- 2. Exam over Chapters assigned

Unit Four

- 1. Read Chapters 14, 15, 18
- 2. Exam over Chapters assigned

Unit five

Course Project: In most of the chapters there is a section entitled "What do you think?" Choose one of these and argue pro or con for your point of view. In defense of your point you may refer to articles, do interviews, or use other sources. The projects are to be typed, double spaced, and **no more than three (3) pages in length**.
