The review is to be two (2) and no more than three (3) pages in length, double spaced and typed. Failure to turn in a project will result in the automatic failure of this course. For each class day that your project is late you will lose 5 points off the project's grade. The project is one exam grade.

Note! No project will be accepted after the class final has been administered.
