COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Identify safety related principles related to childcare; discuss primary nursing care of the pediatric patient and family during health and disease; and apply concepts of growth and development to the care of pediatric patients utilizing a systematic problem-solving process. Introduction to the concepts of Member of a Profession, Provider of Patient-Centered Care, Patient Safety Advocate, and Member of the Health Care Team as related to pediatric patient and family.
